

We are excited to invite you to an information session with representatives from the U.S. Department of the Treasury and U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) to discuss Elective Pay, a program recently established by the Inflation Reduction Act. Elective Pay allows tax-exempt organizations, including local governments, to receive payments from the federal government partially reimbursing costs associated with clean energy and clean transportation projects. These payments can cover up to 50% of eligible project costs and are awarded on a non-competitive basis (i.e., all eligible projects can qualify), making Elective Pay a valuable tool to support New York's clean energy transition.

During the meeting, David Eichenthal, Senior Advisor for Policy Implementation and Delivery from the U.S. Department of the Treasury, and Taresa Lawrence, U.S. DOE's Director of State, Local, and Tribal Policy, will join staff from the NYS Governor's Office to provide valuable insights on how local governments, institutions of higher education, school districts, and non-profits can leverage the IRA's Elective Pay provisions.
