Manlius Town Supervisor Ed Theobald Elected President of Association of Towns of the State of New York

Ed Theobald, supervisor in the Town of Manlius, was elected president for the 2021-2022 term by the delegation to the Association of Towns of the State Annual Business Meeting on Feb. 17. He will officially begin his term on May 1.

As president, Theobald will head the Executive Committee, which oversees AOT operations as its governing board and works with Association staff on key legislative issues at the state and federal levels. Theobald is a long-time member of AOT leadership and just completed his term as head of the Resolutions Committee, which determines the proposed annual legislative platform of the Association, voted on by the delegation to the annual business meeting every February in New York City. He has also served the Association through terms on the Finance and Audit committees, as well as the Bylaws Revision Committee.



Theobald's public service career began in 2004 as Village of Minoa Trustee, and he has been Manlius town supervisor since 2010. He has also served on the NYS Law Enforcement Accreditation Council since 2012.

Also elected at the February meeting were the five vice presidents: Denny Powers, state and federal legislative liaison in the town of Amherst; Bill Moehle, supervisor, town of Brighton; Cindy Goliber, town clerk, town of Potsdam; Michael Marinaccio, supervisor, town of Dickinson; and Tina Ward, town clerk, town of Cobleskill.

The Association of Towns provides legal and technical training and advocacy for the 933 towns of New York State. For the first time in its 87 years, the meeting was held virtually.
